

George Timothy FRENCH



Pre-enlistment:

- George was born in Northampton, England approximately 1879
- He lived in Woodford, Queensland
- His occupation was that of a storekeeper
- He was married to Matilda Ellen FRENCH, and had a daughter Muriel Lorna FRENCH
- He spent 3 years with RAA, Qld
- He served 16 months in QMISA
- He served 6 months in Queensland Coronation Contingent, England
- He spent 5 years with Queensland Police

Military Records

- George enlisted on 19 July 1915 as a Lieutenant, aged 36 years.
- He was in 26th Battalion, 9th Reinforcement.
- On 31 January 1916 he embarked from Brisbane, Queensland, on board HMAT A62 Wandilla to Ypres.
- He was wounded in action on 4 October 1917
- Lieutenant George Timothy FRENCH 'Died of Wounds' 5 October 1917 that he had received in action the day before in Belgium
