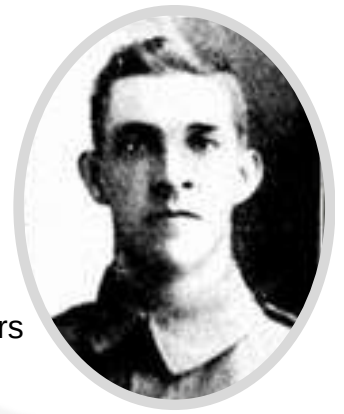


George PRINGLE



Pre-enlistment:

- George was born in 1892 in Martinsville near Newcastle, NSW
- He was the son of Luke Pringle of 'Fieldview', Cloyna, Murgon, QLD.
George's brother, Luke Pringle was killed in action on 7 June 1917 while serving with the 52nd Battalion and has no known grave. His name appears on Menin Gate, Ypres. He was also a brother to Vera Cobb nee Pringle
- He attended Martinsville State School
- He lived in Windera, Murgon, Queensland
- His home town was Cloyna, South Burnett, Qld
- His occupation at the time of enlistment was that of a farmer

Military Records

- Service Number: 259
- George PRINGLE enlisted on 2 September 1914 at Gympie, QLD as a Private with the 9th Infantry Battalion, 3rd Infantry, B Company, aged 22 years 8 weeks
- On 24 September 1914 he embarked with his Unit on board Transport A5 HMAT Omrah, from Brisbane aged 22 years 8 months
- On 28 June he was wounded while in action at Gallipoli
- Private George PRINGLE Died of Wounds (GSW knee joint) at sea, on 7 July 1915 that he received in action at Gallipoli. He was being treated on board the Hospital Ship Sicilia
- His War Service was in Egypt and Gallipoli

- No known grave - "Known Unto God", buried at sea, Chaplain E Teale officiated
