

Stanley John RENOUF



Pre-enlistment:

- Stanley Renouf was born to parents John and Emily RENOUF, Jersey, Channel Islands
- His home town was Kilkivan, Gympie Queensland
- His occupation was that of a labourer and he was a single man
- His next of kin was listed as his mother, Mrs Emily Renouf, Jersey, Channel Islands, England

Military Records

- Service Number: 3616
- Stanley Renouf enlisted on 20 August 1915 as a Private with 25th Battalion, 8th Reinforcement
- On 3 January 1916 he embarked as a Private with his Unit on HMAT Kyarra, from Brisbane, aged 27 years
- His last Unit was 2nd Pioneer Battalion
- His war service was on the Western Front
- Private Stanley John Renouf was killed in action on 16 January 1917 in France aged 29 years

Rifle Shooting

- Stanley Renouf was a member of the Kilkivan Rifle Club
- In a newspaper article dated 16 August 1919, he was 1 of 4 Kilkivan Rifle Club members who made the supreme sacrifice from the 19 members who enlisted. The other 3 members were Sid Beer, W. G. Muir, and H. H. Kitt.
